## 5. VISA

What is the difference between COE and VISA?	COE is a certificate necessary to obtain a VISA. A VISA is necessary in order to enter Japan.

Why is it necessary to submit the Statement of Financial Resources (a certificate to confirm the students have enough financial resources to cover their expenses)?	Because it is one of the documents necessary for students to obtain a COE / VISA at the Immigration Bureau. We are making sure that the students have enough financial resources so that they can concentrate on their studies. We have set the minimum amount at 80,000 yen per month, based on the amount of the JASSO scholarship.
How long will it take to obtain a COE / VISA?	It will take about two to three months after Waseda has applied for them. Please make sure that your students start their application process early so that they will have enough time.
Are exchange students allowed to work?	Yes, but they are required to obtain work-permit at the airport or the Immigration Bureau.

Insurance	It is essential to take out travel insurance in your home country before coming to Japan.  In addition it is compulsory to join Japan's national health insurance. The amount of the premium you must pay varies by city or ward; it is, however, usually about 1,500 yen per month.  Furthermore, taking out optional vehicle liability insurance is recommended, in case of accident. More information will be provided at the general orientation. Please consider taking out this insurance.
